Assembly is 30 minutes before the start time for the round to give time to setup the field. Archers arriving late for assembly will have to fit in with the field.<sup>2</sup>

We normally setup on the right of the field to leave space, if possible, for beginners or archers doing tuning or free practice on the left. Priority is always given to those shooting the day's round, so it may on occasion not be possible for any tuning or free practice.
